Primary Health Care Services Are Still Available

Dear members of Saugeen First Nation,

As you may have heard, Dr. William Dunlop (“Dr. Bill”) has resigned from his position as the SOAHAC and Saugeen family physician, effective January 18, 2018. Dr. Bill is very well liked by everyone. Though we are all disappointed to say farewell, please be assured that **there will be no interruption in primary health care provision for you and your family.**

SOAHAC is actively recruiting for a physician for our clinic in Owen Sound and the Saugeen community. In the meantime, our primary health care team is committed to meeting your health care needs. When you call to make an appointment, you will be booked with one of our three Nurse Practitioners at the clinic in Owen Sound or at the Health Centre.

Nurse Practitioners are nurses with additional education that allows them to provide the same kind of services as a family doctor. They can diagnose, prescribe medications, order tests and treat most medical conditions. The team will also work in consultation with the SOAHAC physician in London and will continue to provide appropriate referrals.

We will do our best to inform you about physician recruitment efforts moving forward. If you have further questions or concerns, please speak to a staff member or contact the Integrated Care Manager at SOAHAC.
